Kathryn Myers

Kathryn Myers is an artist and Professor of Art at the University of Connecticut where she has taught since 1984. She received her BA from St. Xavier College in Chicago, and MFA from The University of Wisconsin, Madison. She is the recipient of Fulbright Fellowships to India in 2002, 2011 and 2020 and Artist Fellowship grants from the Connecticut Office of the Arts in 1991, 2012 and 2019-20. Other awards include the Marie Walsh Sharpe Foundation Studio Residency, in 1989 and 1990. She has exhibited her work in the United States and India and has curated exhibitions on Indian art as well as a video series on contemporary art in India – Regarding India. \$35 for up to three entries.

\$45 for up to five entries.
